

Rules Corner

Do's & Don'ts when dropping in a relief area

At some point in your round you may well have to take relief to play your next stroke. The situation you are in will determine if you have a one club or two club length relief area. Remember any relief that is free [without penalty] you only get one club length relief area. A drop zone is also considered a relief area that has a predetermined size.

Before you drop a ball in a relief area you need to think carefully what you can and cannot do in this area.

You can

- Remove any loose impediments e.g stones, twigs, loose divots etc etc
- Remove any movable obstructions e.g a tee, a wrapper, anything man made.

You cannot

- Alter the surface of the ground by replacing divots in a hole or pressing down divots that have already been replaced.
- Create or eliminate uneven surfaces.
- Flatten out sand where someone has filled a divot hole.
- Breakaway anything growing or attached e.g paspalum, dandelion etc.
