Incidentally, another famous NZ golfer aced a 15<sup>th</sup> hole recently. Steven Alker did so during the 3<sup>rd</sup> round of the Senior Open at Royal Porthcawl, South Wales.

The minutes of the Tasman Golf Board meeting held on the 24<sup>th</sup> July are in the clubhouse minutes folder so members can keep abreast of developments in the region. Three matters caught my attention: First, as with all incorporated societies (including Totaradale GC), Tasman Golf must review its constitution. Sport NZ resources will be available from October. The Act comes into force in October 2023 with a transition period from 5 October until 5 April 2026. Second, Tasman Golf will not be sending a senior women's team to both the 2023 South Island and NZ Interprovincials due to their inability to put together a competitive team. Third, Simon Winter, Club Support Manager, has visited 21 golf clubs throughout the region. The Tasman region goes from Whataroa, Sth Westland to Kaikoura.

Please welcome Keith Haddy as a new member. Keith was away when I contacted him late last month, so may not have been at the club yet. I myself have not played at To-taradale since the 15<sup>th</sup> June due to injury. So I'm somewhat out of the loop with club days.

#### Course Convenor's report:

Hopefully this cold snap is going to be short lived, everything was just drying out nicely. You will notice Bill Filmer one of our energetic volunteers has been busy mulching around the new planting's adjacent to number three. Well done Bill. The mulch was supplied by our man Blair Tilly from Tasman Pine. Thanks Blair. You will also notice we have made a start on root pruning. This will be done in various areas where roots are surfacing and sucking the life out of greens and fairways. This is relatively easy done with the small digger we dry hire but a lot of hard graft to repair the mess and god help the machine operator if he strikes water. If any of you would like to help with the restoration work please let me know.

I've had lots of not so flattering comments about our greens but you can't make an omelette without breaking eggs. One of the reasons they look so bad is I've just sprayed for moss after the very wet season it's flourishing. We will be starting on spring renovations ASAP starting with verti draining then sanding along with fertilizer.

## **Rules Corner**

We are now well into the golfing programme and all sections about to start their Club Champs matches. So perhaps now would be a good time to remind ourselves of some basic Rules of match play:-

- The honour/order of play on the first hole is decided by the draw. Only if there is no draw do players toss a coin.
- Players do not need to announce what ball they are playing with nor if they change their ball [when the Rules permit]
- If an opponent plays from outside the teeing ground or from a wrong tee, it is the player's choice to immediately cancel the opponent's stroke or not. If the player cancels the stroke it is still the opponent's turn to tee off. A cancelled stroke cannot be retracted.
- If an opponent tees off or plays a stroke when it was the player's turn to play the player may cancel the stroke [must be done before either play another stroke] or not. A cancelled stroke cannot be retracted.
- If an opponent inadvertently incurs any penalty for a breach of the Rules and he/she is not aware, the player may apply the penalty or choose to disregard it.
- Before conceding a stroke or hole a player can double check with the opponent how many strokes they have played. Remember an opponent must give the correct number of strokes taken before the player makes another stroke or takes similar action [such as a concession] or they lose the hole unless corrected in time.
- A concession of a stroke or hole once given or implied may not be retracted.
- Players must decide the result of a hole before either tee off the next hole. If unable to agree on the result of a hole, either player needs to state they are making a ruling request and state the facts upon which the ruling is to be based. Players must continue the match until somebody is available to give a ruling. If in doubt who now has the honour toss a coin.
